WATSON STREET FARMERS MARKET RETURNS

The Watson Street Farmers Market opens its 2010 season on Saturday, June 5th. The market, which takes place on the Village Green in downtown Ripon, operates on Tuesday and Saturday mornings, rain or shine, through the end of October.

Farmers markets are an integral part of the urban/farm linkage and have continued to rise in popularity, mostly due to the growing consumer interest in obtaining fresh products directly from the farm. The Watson Street Farmers Market allows consumers to have access to locally grown, farm fresh produce.

"We typically have a nice selection of vendors at the market, with the number growing as the season progresses," said Craig Tebon, Ripon's downtown manager. "Independence Day weekend has typically been the time when area gardens are in full gear. Customers can expect to find farm fresh produce, baked goods, poultry, meats, eggs, honey, and plants."

Direct marketing of produce and products through farmers markets continues to be an important sales outlet for agricultural producers nationwide. Food in the United States travels an average of 1,500 miles to get to the kitchen table. All this shipping uses large amounts of natural resources (especially fossil fuels), contributes greatly to pollution, and creates excess trash with extra packaging. Today, there are nearly 4,800 farmers markets operating throughout the nation.
